This course is for music teachers, jazz musicians, dancers and anyone interested in passing on our great heritage of American jazz to children of all ages. Those who know jazz will learn how to communicate their knowledge through the multifaceted Orff approach while those who know Orff Schulwerk will learn how to adapt it to jazz.



Features:

- A developmental sequence from preschool through middle school as outlined in Doug's two jazz education books, *Now's the Time* and *All Blues*.
- Games, songs, speech pieces, movement activities, body percussion and other child-friendly doorways into jazz.
- Roots music, jazz blues, jazz standards and jazz compositions arranged for the Orff instrumental ensemble.
- Essential jazz theory and key historical, cultural and aesthetic background.
- New material for those who have taken this course before.
- Performance by Doug and the Pentatonics.

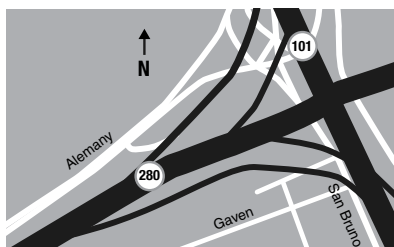


Doug Goodkin recently completed his 42nd year as the music specialist at The San Francisco School. He is internationally recognized as an Orff Schulwerk mast teacher, offering courses in over 40 countries on six continents and directing the prestigious San Francisco International Orff Course. He has taught this course

on Orff and jazz for 25 years throughout the U.S., Canada, South America, Asia, Australia and Europe.

Doug is the author of eight books, including the groundbreaking books on jazz education, *Now's the Time: Teaching Jazz to All Ages* and *All Blues: Jazz for the Orff Ensemble*. He is the director of *Doug Goodkin and the Pentatonics*, a multi-generational group dedicated to family jazz concerts and education.

Directions: From 101 going south, take the 280 South exit (after Army St.), get off immediately on Alemany Blvd. Turn right and bear right onto San Bruno, turn right on Gaven. From 280 going north, take Alemany exit and continue to the end, bearing right on San Bruno as above. From 101 going north, take the Silver Ave. exit, turn left and then left again at the light, right at San Bruno Ave., continue several blocks and turn left on Gaven.
